Economics for Leaders (EFL) is a selective residential summer program for high school students held on 13 prestigious college campuses across the nation. EFL sessions teach young leaders how to integrate economics into the process of decision-making in a hands-on experiential environment. Classes are taught by economics professors and leadership instructors selected, nationwide, for their expertise and teaching effectiveness. EFL builds valuable leadership skills, helps students develop long-lasting connections and, according to many EFL alumni, is "one of the best experiences of their lives."

Program Goals:

- Develop leadership skills that will prepare students for the 21st century economy
- Provide participants with an appreciation of how economic reasoning is integral to decision-making
- Teach students the concepts affecting our global economy
- Provide a fun-filled, active environment rich with new friendships that can last a lifetime
- Help students discover their potential as they assemble their own personal tool kits for effective leadership

Eligibility:

If you are currently a sophomore or junior in high school, you can attend an EFL program.

Scholarships:

45 full scholarships are available to residents of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming. Scholarships cover tuition, travel, lodging, meals, and materials. To receive a scholarship, a student must be accepted into the program and be a resident of one of the states mentioned above.

Admissions:

Admission to EFL is competitive, with admission decisions based on leadership potential, maturity, and vision. Applications will be accepted until the program fills.
